أَكْبَرُ وَلَا حَوْلَ وَلَا قُوَّةَ إِلَّا بِاللَّهِ الْعَلِيِّ الْعَظِيمِ



TRANSLITERATION

Subḥānallāhi wal-ḥamdu lillāhi wa lā ilāha
illallāhu wallāhu akbar wa lā ḥawla wa lā quwwata
illā billāhil-‘Aliyyil-‘Aẓīm

MEANING

Glory be to Allah. All praise belongs to Allah.
There is no deity worthy of worship except Allah.
Allah is the Greatest. There is no power and no
strength except through Allah, the Most High, the
Magnificent.
